Silent Auction to Save Runway 8-26

Mark on your calendar Sunday October 7, 12:00 noon at the Corralitos Community Center, 35 Browns Valley Road in Corralitos. Attend the Harvest Festival and enjoy a barbecue lunch and silent auction. This is a fundraiser to pay for the legal action to prevent housing encroachment in Buena Vista off the end of the east-west runway 8-26. As everybody knows by now, the City of Watsonville plans to annex the Buena Vista area and then build 2,250 or more houses there.

The Friends of Buena Vista (FOBV) and the Watsonville Pilots Association are participating jointly in this silent auction event. FOBV is doing the heavy lifting so far as organization and implementing details. WPA will be contributing by providing items for auction and attending, we hope, in large numbers.

So far WPA members plan to put up for auction: a one week stay at a residence in Palm Springs, a San Francisco Bay tour by aircraft, and a dinner for two at the Shadowbrook Restaurant. We are looking for more auction items to be donated by WPA, other airport people and businesses

Last May the WPA, EAA Chapter 119 and Monterey Bay Chapter of the 99s joined to oppose City manipulation of airport land use planning using the ploy of a proposed stakeholder committee. That was successful. Again solidarity makes sense, this time for the pilot community and FOBV to join hands in this fundraiser. The common goal of legal action by WPA and FOBV, to prevent high-density housing in Buena Vista, is represented by one legal brief. It's a joint effort going to same cause.

Pipeline workers find WWII plane wreckage near Watsonville

Watsonville - Pipeline workers unearthed the wreckage of a Navy dive-bomber that crashed in a field during a Central Coast training The workers were digging a pipeline trench for the Pajaro Valley Water Management Agency on farmland last month when wreckage was discovered six feet down along Trafton Road near the Pajaro River levee east of Highway 1.

Archaeologists for the agency unearthed more plane parts and bone fragments and determined it was the wreckage of a Navy plane that crashed Jan. 14, 1944, Sgt. Mike Richards of the Monterey County Sheriff's Coroner Division said this week.

Old photos of the area show the crash site, now a mushroom farm, was once the location of an airfield and tower. "The Navy probably

did what they could to remove the bodies," Richards said.

A Navy accident report showed Ens. Delbert Crammer Goodspeed and Aviation Radioman 2nd Class Robert Henry Paulson died when the Douglas SBD-5 Dauntless dive bomber crashed during a training flight. The military said the plane "was observed to leave formation at about 10,000 feet in a left gliding turn, present cause undetermined." Goodspeed and Paulson were assigned to Navy bombing squadron VB-18, which had arrived at Watsonville Airport the previous October. The airport was leased by the Navy during World War II and was returned to the city after the war.

Changes to the FAA WINGS Safety Program

Jack Hocker from the San Jose Flight Standards District Office gave a 45-min. presentation concerning changes in the FAA WINGS Safety Program that will start in January 2008. His first concern was a question of "How safe are pilots that participate in the WINGS program?" The new program will be able to track this, the present program cannot. The new program will also satisfy a pilot's requirement for the BFR. Also the flight Instructor must participate and be registered to get credit for the BFR

The FAA will focus on the three major problem areas of 1) Approach & Landings, 2) Fuel Management, and 3) Continued VFR into IMC. There will be 3 major phases in the new program; 1) Basic Phase, 2) Advanced Phase, and 3) Master Phase.

To start, one must go to http://faasafety.gov/, register, and then set-up a profile.
